## 2012 Report

The Greensboro Free Library received \$1500 from the Association in 2011 for its summer children's programs. These include a weekly story hour and a summer reading program entitled "Dream Big Read", which encourages children of all ages to read. It will end with a party and raffle prizes to celebrate the summer readers. Chris Morey created a mural painting of Greensboro on display at the library with the help of our young patrons. Additionally a "Stop Motion Video Animation Demonstration" for school-age children was given by Meredith Holch. Story Hours are held every Thursday at the Library. In addition there are eight programs centered on specific presenters.

Rose Friedman, Youth Services Librarian, offers story hours for preschoolers every Thursday at 10:00 am followed by a craft session here at the library. Area homeschoolers meet here every Thursday at 2:00. She also works with the Lakeview Kindegarten and Wonder and Wisdom. In addition, on a year-round basis Librarian Mary Metcalf reads to 3 different groups of children and adults at the Four Seasons Early Learning Center, which has a story hour for about 20 children every Tuesday.
