Greensboro Association (GA) grants are made possible by the generosity of our membership in support of this community we all love and to ensure its vitality for generations to come. Funded by annual gifts and endowment funds from the Fund for Greensboro, the Grants Program provides support to a variety of community organizations and initiatives that reflect the GA's mission and goals. The GA's grants committee currently encourages grant requests for specific initiatives and one-year community projects as well as supporting grants for operating expenses for previous grant recipients.

In July 2023, the Grants Committee awarded \$27,500 through its annual grants program to 18 grantees, in support of outstanding community programming, town initiatives, and general operations for organizations that provide essential services to the Greensboro community. The generosity of the GA membership has allowed our annual grants awards to steadily increase and we look forward to continuing this trend in support of a vibrant Greensboro.

Immediately following the devastating storm that flooded our area on July 10th, 2023, the GA began fundraising through our Community Relief Fund to support flood recovery throughout the greater-Greensboro area. In the first week following the flood, the GA Grants committee awarded \$20,000 to groups working directly with community members who were impacted by this disaster, coordinating immense volunteer efforts, and providing essential food, supplies, and shelter.

We are continuing to raise donations for additional waves of funding to support the flood relief and rebuilding efforts that are just getting started. The GA's Grants Committee is continuing to communicate with local groups and funders to identify gaps and areas of greatest need as we look to clear the wreckage and rebuild our community even stronger than before!
