## **Funky Fourth**

John Schweizer helped to lead an incredible funky fourth, with a bigger and more varied parade than ever, free picnic, pie auction, and more. The auction raised \$4400 to support the Food Pantry, Aware, and the Greensboro Nursing Home. The cost breakdown was as follows:

The **Greensboro Community Garden** This is an active group of 12 core volunteers with additional supporters. Harvests have been plentiful, with over 100 lbs. of produce donated to the Hardwick Area Food Pantry to date. The \$500 GA grant bought two hi-rise water sprinklers as well as no-kink, lightweight hoses, which were super helpful for ease of getting the seeds and seedlings established. Much community outreach this summer, including

1) event at the Greensboro Free Library featuring Breadseed Farm from East Craftsbury on "Maximizing the Harvest",

2) collaboration with Smith's Grocery in Greensboro Bend: over 50lbs of produce has been donated, stocking the chiller cabinet in the store on Fridays with fresh vegetables.

3) collaboration with Rural Arts and the Bend Revitalization Initiative to supply salad and veggies with dip at the Basketball Skills Event at the Bend Community Park in early August.

4) two savory donations from Community Garden lead volunteer, Jenny Bales to the Funky Fourth Pie Auction.

5) involved in Greensboro Farmers Market, especially on Kids Day, with a "Veggies Rock Hunt" activity.

6) community workshop on mushroom growing, and discussing a collaboration with the "Grow Your Own" program sponsored by the Center for an Agricultural Economy.
